WHAT A CAMP WEEK LOOKS LIKE

Every week is different.

Activities don't generally repeat for at least 3-4 consecutive weeks.

Multiple disciplines every week:

drawing, painting, music, clay modeling, acting, filmmaking, STEM games, art & craft, and outdoor activity (weather permitting).

Campers make a real movie.

They pitch the ideas and write the script; it is shot and edited by professional moviemakers, and shared on our YouTube channel within a week.

One-day and half-day camps too.

Each one is planned as a complete experience — a camper who joins for a single day never feels they missed something.
